## from the pastor's desk

*"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it" (Malachi 3:10 NIV).*

Tithing is a spiritual practice given by God to humankind to assist people in finding abundance, fulfillment, and gratitude in their everyday lives. The practice of tithing is to give 10 percent of one's increase back to God, with God represented on the physical level by the source of one's spiritual teachings — in our case, the church.

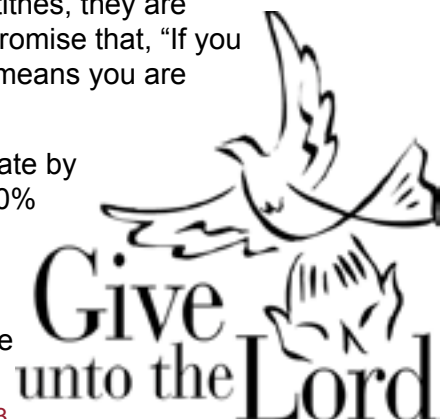
As humankind fulfills its part of the covenant by giving 10 percent to God, then God fulfills God's part by continually blessing us. When a person tithes, they are expressing their faith in the promise that, "If you have that much to give, that means you are open to receive more."

It's simple to tithe: you calculate by multiplying your income by 10% and then giving that amount to the church. Tithing can be done weekly, monthly, quarterly or annually. It's done for the joy of giving and as

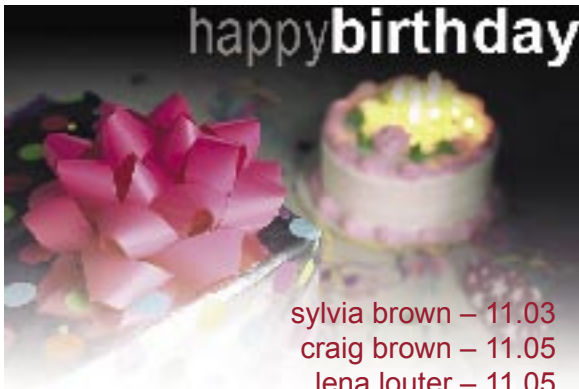

\*The Youth Worship Celebration takes place on the Sunday before Thanksgiving. It is an opportunity for the youth of the presbytery to gather to praise God and give thanks. Worship and music leaders are invited from various Grace Presbytery congregations. Speakers are usually members of the senior class, and communion servers are youth from across the presbytery who have been elected by their church to serve as elders and deacons. The YMC recruits a special planning team to organize this service.

The Lord be with you! Greetings from Iowa to all of our friends in Allen. It's a surprisingly warm fall Sunday afternoon here in Iowa as I write this to you. The leaves are at the height of their fall color, midterm exams are looming, and baseball playoffs and football are on the TV. We continue to be doing just fine and, as always, we appreciate all of your thoughts and prayers. I preached at our local church today, in front of by far the biggest congregation to hear one of my sermons. The next time that I'll preach will be with you in mid-November! Becky and I will both be there and we're very excited about the trip.

The children and youth of the church put on their annual children's skit as a part of our worship this morning. They performed a play based on the life and decisions of Esther. David and Loren (our identical twin boys for those new to the church) played the part of the king and the king's talking picture. The congregation had a great time with the skit. I'd say that we definitely glorified and enjoyed God this morning!

Some of you may recognize that phrase as the answer to the first question in the two Westminster catechisms. I've always thought of this as a surprising and liberating answer to the question: "What is the chief end of humanity?". It's exciting to think that our primary purpose and goal in life is simply to glorify and enjoy God. Those of you that know me, know that I have an odd and overgrown sense of humor, so I definitely like to find the joy in life. It makes me chuckle to read that people way back in the 1600s also thought we should be enjoying God. That phrase changes my mental image of our church forefathers from a dour and serious lot to a group that, while still serious, recognized that our life's purpose involves enjoyment! I think that's something that all of us can remember every now and then. When I hear laughter in church and see the youth and children taking an active part in our worship, I get happy and I truly think God does as well.

I also think it bears remembering that the writers of the catechism said that we should glorify and enjoy God forever. Forever. To me, that means every day here on earth and not just Sunday mornings. If we can approach questions in our lives with an attitude of glorification and enjoyment of God, I think that we'd probably come up with a lot of better answers. I'm not saying this is easy, especially when times are challenging or things aren't going well. But, we are always able to choose the attitude that we'll have when we address life's challenges. It seems to me that an attitude based in God's glory as well as seeking to enjoy God would serve us well in every instance! We think about all of you often and our church is in our prayers. We will be seeing you soon!
